Help! My A/C Isn't Cooling!

You just arrived home after a long day at work. You are tired and hot. You walk in the door and you are not greeted by the cool air you anticipated on the drive home.

"Why now?", you ask. Let me explain how your air conditioner works.

Unlike furnaces, air conditioners are complex mechanical systems that depend on a wide variety of conditions to work correctly. They are sized to meet a certain "load" on the house as well as to have a certain amount of refrigerant, known as the "charge". They are

also designed to have a certain amount of air flow across the coils. When any of these things change, the system will have problems.

There are a number of factors which can contribute to the air conditioner being unable to properly cool. Changes in the house such as more people, cooking, running a dishwasher, computers or other heat generating equipment can affect your air conditioners ability to cool or maintain a comfortable temperature in your home.

If the refrigerant charge has developed a leak, it lowers the capacity of the system. If airflow across the outdoor coil is reduced, the ability to reject heat outdoors is reduced and the capacity of the system will go down especially if outdoor temperatures are high.

Something as simple as not changing your furnace filter will affect the ability of the air conditioner to cool your home. A plugged filter diminishes air flow throughout the house. The fan simply cannot push the cooled air through the plugged

filter. This will ultimately result in the evaporator coil freezing. If the unit continues to operate under this circumstance, the air conditioner's performance will worsen, damaging the compressor until it eventually fails—leaving you with an expensive repair bill!

Here are a few simple things that you dan do:

 Check your filter monthly and change when dirty.

Tax Credits and Focus On Energy

A number of tax credits for residential energy efficiency have been renewed. These tax credits are available for purchases made in 2016. Energy Star products eligible for tax credits are independently certified to save energy, save money and protect the environment.

Armstrong's gas furnaces that are greater or equal to 95% AFUE qualify for a \$150.00 tax credit. If the furnace has a variable speed motor (ECM fan motor) it qualifies for an additional \$50.00 tax credit.

If you choose to replace your air conditioner at the same time, we can pair the qualifying furnace with Armstrong's 14

SEER air conditioner. This pairing actually allows us to achieve a 16 SEER rating, making the air conditioner also eligible for a tax credit of \$300.00 This brings the total tax credit to a maximum of \$500.00.

Focus on Energy also has cash back rewards for replacing your heating and cooling equipment. Armstrong's 95% AFUE or greater, multi-stage natural gas furnace with a variable speed motor, qualifies for a \$125.00 cash back reward. If paired with Armstrong's 14 SEER air conditioner, which allows us to achieve a 16 SEER rating, the pair qualifies for a \$250.00 total cash back reward. In total you

are looking at a savings of \$750.00.

The tax credits and Focus On Energy incentives are for existing homes only, which are owner occupied. Both of these incentives expire on December

STUFFED ZUCCHINI

1 LB. HAMBURGER, BROWNED 1-1/2 LBS. ZUCCHINI 1-1/2 CUPS FRESH BREAD CRUMBS 3/4 CUP GRATED CHEDDAR CHEESE OR TO TASTE 1/2 LB. CHEDDAR CHEESE, CUBED OR TO TASTE 1/4 CUP MINCED ONION OR TO TASTE 2 TBLS SNIPPED PARSLEY 1-1/4 TSP SALT 1/8 TSP PEPPER 2 EGGS, BEATEN 2 TBLS BUTTER

SCRUB ZUCCHINI WELL. CUT OFF ENDS. COOK WHOLE WITH 1 TSP SALT IN 1 INCH BOILING WATER, COVERED, 5-7 MINUTES. HEAT OVEN TO 350°. CUT THE ZUCCHINI IN HALVES, LENGTHWISE AND REMOVE SEEDS. WITH A SPOON, SCOOP OUT THE FLESH, LEAVING ABOUT 1/2 INCH THICK SHELL ALL AROUND THE ZUCCHINI. DICE THE FLESH AND COMBINE WITH HAMBURGER, BREAD CRUMBS, CUBED CHEESE, ONION, PARSLEY, SALT, PEPPER AND BEATEN EGG. SPOON MIXTURE INTO ZUCCHINI SHELLS. DOT WITH BUTTER. SPRINKLE WITH GRATED CHEESE. PLACE THE SHELLS ON A COOKIE SHEET. BAKE FOR 30 MINUTES OR UNTIL BROWNED.

2 CUPS OF ORANGE JUICE

2 CUPS COLD WATER

2 CUPS ORANGE SHERBET

1 TEASPOON VANILLA EXTRACT 1 CUP CONFECTIONERS' SUGAR
